




Earthquake Relief Help

Bridge Club Nepal (BCN)

“We are the Bridge”

Nepal Earthquake on 25th April 2015 at 11:56 Nepal Standard Time with a magnitude of 7.8 M killed over 8,000 people and injured more than 21,000. Its epicenter was east of the district of Lamjung. Hundreds of thousands of people were made homeless with entire villages flattened, across many districts of the country. It was the worst natural disaster to strike Nepal since the 1934 Nepal–Bihar earthquake.

Centuries old buildings were destroyed at **UNESCO World Heritage sites** in the Kathmandu Valley, including some at the **Kathmandu Durbar Square**, the **Patan Durbar Square**, the **Bhaktapur Durbar Square**, the **Changu Narayan Temple** and the **Swayambhunath Stupa**.

Nepal is still experiencing aftershocks in regular interval.

In this difficult situation, **Asian Pacific Children's Convention (APCC), Fukuoka, Japan** decided to lend a helping hand. **BRIDGE CLUB Nepal (BCN)** is very grateful and pleased to receive **NRS 168,412.20** (Nepalese currency). Thousands of children and young people living in the districts most affected by the earthquake have lost their books and uniforms. **BCN**, then, decided to donate the sum received to affected children in the form of stationery materials.

BCN successfully conducted donation for 194 affected children in four districts: **Nuwakot, Bhaktapur, Sindhuli** and **Sindhupalchowk**.

Nuwakot is 65KM from capital city (Kathmandu) and is the earthquake-affected city. On 23rd Jan 2016, BCN conducted donation program for 104 students.

Bhaktapur is 10KM west from capital city. It is another earthquake-affected area. On 8th May 2016, BCN conducted donation program for 80 affected children in **Gyan Bikas Primary School**. We also talked with School staff and Principal to know more about school present situation. We were informed that original school building has completely been collapsed by earthquake. It is now being operated in temporary bamboo cottage built by Nepal Army in sponsor from various NGOs. All students belonged to marginalized community. During winter season most of the students were coming to school without proper woolen clothes. Seeing this, teachers decided to raise money from their salary and bought a **pair of woolen jacket** for each student. Also, every Friday principal of the school provides **meal to each student**. It is because many students come to school without proper breakfast or lunch and providing meal every day wasn't possible from his salary so he opted to atleast feed once a week. We are very happy to be able to help such needful children.

Also, BCN provided stationery materials to 10 homeless children in **Sindhuli** District. Sindhuli is 134+KM from capital city and is also one of the earthquake-affected city.

Sindhupalchowk is 65+KM from capital city and is one of the most severely earthquake-affected city. On 11th June 2016, BCN conducted donation program for 70 affected students.
